Object: Call for entries "Places to be"

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The Human Cities network has been thought in the continuation of the international colloquium «Human cities, sustainable environmental design», organised by Pro Materia and which took place in Brussels in May 2007. This meeting was the first part of a more extensive project reflecting on the urban public space, and it's cultural and human dynamics, as well as on the interdisciplinarity between the numerous professions and stakeholders of the public space. The success of this event led to the creation of a partnership between the Higher Institute of Architecture of the French Community in Belgium (ISACF-*La Cambre*), coordinator of the project, the association *Pro Materia* based in Brussels (B) as well as the *Lighthouse* - Scotland's Centre for Architecture, Design and the City in Glasgow (UK), the *Politecnico* in Milan (IT) and the *UPIRS*-Urban Planning *Institute of the Republic of Slovenia*, seated in Lljubljana (SI) with the support of the 2007-2013 European Union Culture programme.

The main objectives of the project consist of implementing, from a European perspective, shared interdisciplinary thoughts and ideas on the socio-cultural dynamics of sustainable design in urban public spaces.

Planned for May 2010, the Human Cities Festival is designed as a multidisciplinary public event (conferences, exhibitions, performances in public spaces,...) which offers a unique opportunity to collaborate with numerous socio-cultural actors from Brussels and elsewhere active in contemporary public art and public spaces. To stoke the festive side of the Festival and in order to spread awareness to the greatest number of people, we are also motivated by all types of artistic happenings or performances which are able to illustrate the Human Cities concept. In the future the initiative will be organised every two years to help to contribute to the development of cities that are more humane.

We have already launched a series of events designed to make as many people as possible aware of the Human Cities Festival:

- A European call for entries has been launched in order to be able to present a series of visuals expressing the Human Cities concept (photographic reporting, video, objects,...). The chosen projects and reports will constitute the core of an exhibition which will be shown in the partner cities and in Brussels, in the context of the Festival.

- A symposium with an international colloquium will be organised in Brussels during the Festival. This event will coincide with the publication of a book summarising the conclusions of the think tank groups, of the research and contacts made in the field and the contributions of the speakers invited to the colloquium.

- The educational edition, based on awareness-raising and communication will materialise through the organisation in Brussels of a pedagogical and experimental module organised in the framework of the Festival.
